

Wireless Microphones, Intercom, Instrument packs and In-Ears can be used as secondary user in the Netherlands.

This is license exempt if operated with a maximum of 50 mW ERP and used in the following frequency ranges.

They share these ranges with DVB-T.

470 – 556 MHz
558 – 564 MHz
566 – 572 MHz
574 – 580 MHz
582 – 588 MHz
590 – 596 MHz
598 – 604 MHz
614 – 694 MHz
738 – 753 MHz
823 – 832 MHz
863 – 865 MHz (10 mW)

Wireless Microphones and intercom systems based on DECT can be used license exempt in the following frequency range. They share this frequency range with the inhouse telephone system in local intercom systems.

1880-1900 MHz

Radios (Two-Way Radios, Walkie Talkies) can be operated license exempt if they comply with the PMR446 standard:

*“Hand portable (no base station or repeater use); short range peer to peer mode
Integral antennas only; effective radiated power not exceeding 500 mW and angle modulated Fixed frequencies, in the 446.00000 and 446.20000 range.”*

They share this frequency band with other PMR446 users.

All other radios need to be licensed.

In order to be able to apply for a license we need the following information:

The make, model of the used radios.

Total number of radios.

The number of frequencies (channels) needed.

The programmed frequencies

We need 4 weeks to process the apply.

Permit costs depend on the time the Telecom Agency needs to process the application and therefore depends on the number of frequencies, location of use and programmed frequencies.

This can vary from approximately €400 for a few easy frequencies in an easy location and €490 for 16 easy frequencies in an easy location to €575 for 16 difficult frequencies in a difficult location.
